<u>REMINDER: APPLICATION OPENS MONDAY, NOVEMBER 16</u> <u>BUSINESS INTERRUPTION GRANT PROGRAM</u>

The Arkansas Legislative Council has approved a proposal by the Arkansas Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism, the Arkansas Economic Development Commission, and the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration utilize \$50 million in CARES Act funds for grants to Arkansas businesses.

The grants will reimburse a portion of specific eligible expenses in the personal care, tourism, travel, recreation, and hospitality industries incurred between March 1 and September 30, 2020. The application period will open on **Monday, November 16** and close on **Wednesday, November 25**. Grants will be allocated proportionally depending upon the total number of application and amounts sought. An "eligible business" under the program include corporations, partnerships, sole proprietorships, limited liability companies, joint ventures, or non-profit 501(c)(3) organizations that meet the following criteria:

- Operates primarily within Arkansas in the industries of personal care, tourism; travel, Recreation, or related industries;
- Was established on or before March 1, 2020;
- Has an established tax identification number in the State of Arkansas;
- Requires program assistance due to current economic uncertainty;
- In the case of a business entity, is incorporated in Arkansas or registered to do business within Arkansas;
- Employs 250 or fewer full time Arkansas employees as of September 30, 2020;
- Has customers and/or employees physically coming to the place of business or conducts business on customer premises in Arkansas;
- Does not owe delinquent taxes to the State of Arkansas;

An "eligible expense" is a cost incurred by an Eligible Business due to public health measures or business interruption consisting of:

- Business expenses incurred as a direct resolute of COVID-19 mitigation;
- Certain ordinary business expenses incurred as a direct result of a government mandated business closure or restriction due to COVID-19; or
- Business expenses incurred due to diminished capacity of operations that are likely to continue until health conditions allow functioning at full capacity.
